JOB SUMMARY

The school bus driver operates school buses and other district vehicles in transporting passengers to and from school, special events, and other school-related activities.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Obey all traffic laws; observe all mandatory safety regulations for school buses.
- Operate all school bus equipment properly and safely.
- Maintain order and use appropriate student management skills and follow District procedures for oversight of students riding on the school bus.
- Report all student incidents to the Transportation Director or designee.
- Clean assigned bus regularly.
- Meet responsibilities of assigned schedule; notify the proper authority in case of mechanical failure or inability to meet assigned schedule.
- Check bus before each operation for mechanical defects.
- Transport only authorized students.
- Maintain scheduled routes as assigned; pick up and discharge students only at authorized stops.
- Report all accidents immediately to the Transportation Director or designee.
- Ensure safe evacuation of students from bus in emergency situations.
- Complete forms, records, and reports, legibly and accurately, in a timely manner as required.
- Maintain a professional image, appearance, and demeanor.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Valid Washington Driver's License, with acceptable driving record required.
- Commercial Driver's License (CDL) and certification by the State of Washington as an authorized school bus driver, or ability to obtain required.
- Successful completion of school bus driver training course, which includes 40+ hours of classroom and in-bus, on the road training.
- Be at least 21 years of age with one-year experience as driver of truck or commercial vehicle or at least five (5) years of experience as driver of a passenger vehicle.
- Favorable WSP and FBI fingerprint background check.
- All drivers are subject to pre-and random post-employment testing for controlled substances and alcohol.
- Valid First Aid/CPR certification required.
- Has, in the judgment of the administration, demonstrated aptitude and competence for assigned responsibilities, including the ability to:
- Interact patiently with a diverse student population;
- React quickly and appropriately to visual and/or audible stimuli;
- Communicate clearly and tactfully with students and adults; and
- Maintain confidentiality.
- Able to meet and maintain physical and agility requirements as noted below in physical requirements.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Have the physical dexterity and ability to:
 - o Operate a large vehicle; and
 - o Evacuate students in emergency situations.
